3. Assessment Matters

(i) P5 e-Oral Examination Practice Session for Mother Tongue Languages

The format for the PSLE Mother Tongue Language (MTL) Oral examination will be revised in 2017. In the new format, a video clip instead of a picture will be used to trigger a richer conversation between the student and examiner.

Students have been using interaction packages and given exposure to the use of video clips for conversation since 2012. Conversational practices had been incorporated into MTL lessons at all levels to hone students' oratorical skills.

Students from the current Primary 5 cohort would be receiving further training and practice session to familiarise themselves with the e-Oral Exam system and the new Examination format on the following dates:

(ii) HOLISTIC ASSESSMENT (FOR PRIMARY 1 & 2 ONLY)

Holistic Assessment (HA) focuses on the holistic development of a child and uses child-centric assessment practices such as bite-sized tests. Holistic Assessment provides valuable feedback on students' development and allows them to develop confidence and desire to learn.

Holistic Assessment replaces the traditional pen and paper end of semester examinations. Hence, there will be <u>NO Semestral Examination 1 (SA1)</u> for both Primary 1 & 2 students. However, P2 students will sit for the SA2 at the end of the year.

Holistic Assessment will be carried out for students in P1 and P2 in Term 2. The schedules for P1 and P2 HA have been given out last term.

(iii) ALTERNATIVE ASSESSMENT (FOR PRIMARY 3 to 5)

The school will be conducting alternative modes of assessment for our Primary 3, Primary 4 and Primary 5 students over and above the traditional pen-and-paper exercises. Our school has chosen to adopt a more balanced approach to teaching and learning so as to enrich our students' learning experiences by providing them with the opportunities to experience success through the exhibition of other skills. Please refer to **Annex A & B (for P3 to P5 students only)** on the Alternative Assessment Plan for this Term.

(iv) SEMESTRAL ASSESSMENT 1 (FOR PRIMARY 3 TO 6)

The schedule for SA1 has been sent to parents last term. The schedule is at **Annex C** ((for P3 to P6 students only) for your convenience. We would like to urge all parents to help supervise your children in the preparation for the coming Semestral Assessment 1. Adequate preparation for the examination is important for your children to do well and would reduce stress and anxiety as the examination approaches.

4. Absentees for SA1 & SA2

If your child is absent for the Oral Exam, your child will be able to do the makeup Oral Examination on another day fixed by the school. We would like to inform parents/guardians that <u>makeup session will only be conducted for Oral Examination</u>. There will be <u>no makeup</u> for all written papers. This is in line with the examination practice for national examinations.

If your child is absent for any of the written papers during semestral examinations, the teacher will let your child do the paper <u>as a practice exercise</u> at a later date. The paper will be marked to enable your child to learn and gauge his/her performance. However, <u>the</u> marks will not be recorded.

Students who are absent from SA1/SA2 must produce a Medical Certificate or have other valid reasons for their absence. Their marks will then be computed based on this consideration.

Students who are absent from examinations without a valid reason will be marked as being absent without valid reason. No marks will be awarded for the papers that they have missed.

6. Language Fiesta in April

The English Language Department will be organising a number of activities in April as part of the Language Fiesta event. 7. Sports Day on Fri 8 April

Our 29th Sports Day is on Fri 8 Apr and will be held in the Yishun Stadium.

All P1 and P2 students **need not** attend school on Sports Day.

All P3 to P6 students need to report to school by 7.15 am on Sports Day. They are to report in their House T-shirts and PE shorts. For the girls, they would have to put on their skirts. All **P3 to P6** students who are staying near to the Stadium may opt to report directly to the Stadium at **7.45 am**.

For safety reasons as well as for the purpose of attendance tracking, we would like parents to indicate in the reply slip attached with this letter whether your child/ward will be reporting to school or directly to the Stadium. The school bus will send students to the school in the morning as usual for those taking school bus on a daily basis.

All students will be <u>dismissed from the Stadium at around 11.00 am.</u> For students who are taking school bus on a daily basis, the school bus will be at the stadium to take them home. For those who are not, please ensure that you have arranged for someone to pick your child/ward from the stadium.

We would like to take this opportunity to extend an invitation to our parents to grace this occasion and to participate in the parent/child race.

8. Sale of Plants for Mother's Day on Fri 6 May

The school will be holding a Plant Sale on **Fri, 6 May**. These plants have been grown by our students from the Science Club, together with a few parents from our PSG and teachers too. In tandem with our school core values of Respect and Empathy, we would like to encourage our students to show appreciation to their mothers on Mother's Day by presenting them with a pot of plants. The money collected from the sale will be donated to two charities — Tan Tock Seng Hospital Community Charity Fund and the Singapore Children's Cancer Foundation.

The plants will be on sale to our students during their recesses on 6 May. We would appreciate it if you could encourage your child to start putting aside some of their pocket money so that they can use their savings to purchase the pots of plants to give them away to their loved ones as an expression of gratitude. The cost of the plants ranges from \$2 to \$10.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank all our parents in advance for contributing to this meaningful event in one way or another.

9. Parent-Teacher Meeting (PTM) on Fri 27 May

We have taken note of feedback from parents indicating a preference for the Parent-Teacher Meetings to be held after Semestral Examination 1 rather than in Term 1. Hence, the Parent-Teacher Meet for P1 to P6 will be held after Semestral Examination 1, on Fri 27 May, from 7.30am to 5.00pm.

As parents and guardians will be invited to the school to meet up with your child's/ward's teachers, there will be <u>NO</u> lessons for all students on that day.

As we progress in our journey towards Holistic Assessment, we would like to engage students to assess their own learning and to be able to communicate their learning. As a start, parents of P2 students will be encouraged to bring their children along with them to the PTM. During the conferencing, the student will have the opportunity to articulate their learning and goals to the parents and teachers. In doing so, we hope that our children will learn to take ownership of their learning from a young age. The significant adults in their lives such as their parents and teachers, will in turn be able to better support them in their learning journey.

We strongly encourage you to take this opportunity to meet up with your child's/ward's teachers to discuss how your child/ward is learning and developing at school.

Details for the (PTM) will be issued in a separate letter at a later date.

10. Gifted Education Programme (GEP) Identification (Primary 3 only)

We would like to confirm that the dates for the GEP Identification Exercise are as follows:

a) GEP Screening Exercise (English Language and Mathematics) on <u>26 August 2016</u> (Friday)

Shortlisted pupils will be invited to participate in the second part of the exercise which is the Selection Exercise

b) GEP Selection Exercise (English Language, Mathematics and General Ability) on <u>18, 19</u> October <u>2016</u> (Tuesday, Wednesday). Parents of students who are shortlisted will be notified separately closer to the date.

The GEP Screening and Selection Exercises will be based on the Primary 1 to Primary 3 English Language and Mathematics syllabuses. Please note the following:

Screening Exercise (Mathematics)

All topics in the Primary 3 Mathematics syllabus are included except for topics on "Area and Perimeter", "Geometry" and "Time".

• Selection Exercise (Mathematics)

All topics in the Primary 3 Mathematics syllabus are included except for Angles, Perpendicular and Parallel lines in the topic of Geometry.

The GEP Identification Exercise aims to identify suitable pupils with high intellectual potential. There is no need for the school or parents to carry out test-preparation activities as they could inflate pupils' scores and not reflect their actual potential. Pupils who are not ready to handle the intellectual rigour and demands of the programme will struggle with the enriched curriculum and not benefit fully from it.

11. Healthy Meals In School Programme (HMSP)

We are glad to inform you that the school is implementing the 'Healthy Meals in Schools Programme* (HMPS) from Term 2. This programme is a collaborative effort between Health Promotion Board (HPB) and the Ministry of Education. HMSP seeks to enhance the availability of healthier food and beverage choices in all schools.

Canteen stall holders of Peiying Primary have recently undergone training in meal preparation to learn how to cut down fat, sugar and salt and include whole-grains, fruit and vegetables in the meals that are served in the canteen

The cost of food sold in the canteen will not be affected with the implementation of HMSP.

13. Haze Readiness

As part of Haze Preparedness, we would like to remind parents and guardian to ensure that your child has his/her medication with him/her if the child has a medical condition and is sensitive to air quality. For example, if your child is asthmatic and needs an inhaler, make sure an inhaler is in the school bag when the child is in school.

14. Helping our children to learn to take responsibility

Character building is very important in Peiying Primary School. Our focus is on inculcating Perseverance, Respect, Integrity, Diligence and Empathy (PRIDE). We hope that family and school could work together to inculcate our PRIDE values in our children.

We notice that a few of our students have the habit of calling their parents when they forget to bring certain items to school. Our students should learn how to respect their parents' time and not cause inconvenience to their parents because of their forgetfulness. Students should also learn to take personal responsibility to ensure that they pack their bags with care.

We would like to urge parents to let their children learn to face the consequences of their forgetfulness and to refrain from responding to their children's requests to come to the school with their 'forgotten things' during curriculum time. Home-school partnership in this matter will help our children to cultivate responsibility and respect.
